<p>Your response:</p> <p>The NRP does provide an opportunity for many researchers but it does not directly provide opportunities for those who research the underpinning human behaviours that lead to, or prevent, the desired changes.</p>	<p>Rationale:</p> <p>In all of the goals listed under this NRP human behaviour is either central to achieving the outcome or it is the outcome. It is therefore critical to explicitly include the investigation of the human behaviour and the factors that influence it in the descriptors so that researchers with appropriate expertise may readily justify their contribution to meeting the NRP.</p>

<p>Your response:</p> <p>In order to explicitly include the critical element of human behaviour change required to achieve the stated outcomes reword:</p> <p>AN ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE AUSTRALIA <i>Transforming the way we utilise our land, water, mineral and energy resources through a better understanding of human and environmental systems and the use of new technologies.</i></p> <p>To</p> <p>AN ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE AUSTRALIA <i>Transforming the way we utilise our land, water, mineral and energy resources through a better understanding of human behaviour and environmental systems, the use of new technologies and the manner in which their adoption may be encouraged.</i></p>	<p>Rationale:</p> <p>In all of the areas listed under this NRP the modification of human behaviour is central to achieving the outcome, and indeed has been a major impediment in areas such as management of the Murray-Darling water resource, but the investigation of current human behaviours and how they may be modified is not explicitly included in the descriptors. The current wording therefore has the potential to exclude important contributions from many psychologists who are currently researching how more sustainable behaviours may be encouraged.</p>

Are there any amendments which should be considered to the existing language of the <i>Promoting and Maintaining Good Health</i> NRP and/or its associated priority goals to refresh its relevance to contemporary Australia? Please comment on the proposed amendments provided above, provide specific examples of any new proposed amendments and provide the context to explain your comments and suggestions.</p>	
<p>Your response:</p> <p>This NRP should make explicit reference to mental health being relevant to all of the priority goals. Currently it is only listed under Ageing well, ageing productively and Preventative health care but is just as relevant to all of the other goals.</p> <p>This could be achieved by rewording the header text from:</p> <p>PROMOTING AND MAINTAINING GOOD HEALTH <i>Promoting good health and well being for all Australians.</i></p> <p>To:</p> <p>PROMOTING AND MAINTAINING GOOD HEALTH <i>Promoting good physical and mental health and well</i></p>	<p>Rationale:</p> <p>Mental Health has often been overlooked in discussions relating to Health and this is now widely regarded as a serious omission. We believe that mental health should be explicitly recognised under this NRP so as to provide active encouragement of mental health research as part of the broader objective.</p>

For that reason we suggest rewording of two goals to explicitly recognize the value of research on the manner in which humans understand and make decisions based on available data.</p>
